

# BEACH TRIP

The Alpha Chapter of North Carolina State College and the Delta Cahpter of Clemson University have completed plans for the 1964 National Convention of Mu Beta Psi. The convention is to be held at Myrtle Beach, S. C. from May 31 through June \$\mathbb{C}\$. Both chapters will be housed at the Sands Apartments, South Ocean Boulevard.

The week is planned as a combination of business and pleasure, promising to be an enjoyable week for all present. Besides conducting the serious business of the national convention, the brothers of the two chapters will have a good chance to become better acquainted. John H. Butler, Director of Bands at Clemson, faculty advisor of the Delta Chapter, and National Executive Secretary of Mu Beta Psi, will serve as chaperone for the event.

Alpha chapter will have approximately eight to ten members in attendance and Delta chapter will have approximately twenty-five members present.

### PINS

Word has been received from the L. G. Balfour Company of Attleboro, Mass., that work is under way on dies for the new Mu Beta Psi fraternity pins.

The bin will be available in either close-set or crown-set pearls, with white gold. The center of the pin is red enamel, with letters of the fraternity superimposed (in white) on the three corners of the triangular shape.

Costs will be as follows: close-set pearls are \$24.02 (incouding 10% federal excise and 3% state taxes); crown-set pearls for \$32.21 (also including taxes).

A guard for chapter identification (the letter "Alpha" or the letter "Delta" is available at \$3.12 in white gold, \$6.22 in close-set pearls, or \$8.77 in crown-set pearls (all these prices include taxes). Officer "dangles" are available in white gold at \$3.68 or yellow gold at \$2.55. Postage allowance should be included with each order.

and payment in full should be included. The chapter treasurers must co-sign orders so that unauthorized personnel can not purchase pins. Manufacture of pins can begin about June 1 of this year.

The Clemson College chapter of Mu Beta Psi recently presented its annual production of SPRING SOUNDS, featuring various musical groups from the Clemson campus and nearby. This year's entertainment varied from rock'n roll groups to a featured quitarist from the Clemson faculty.

About six hundred persons attended Delta Chapter's sixth annual SPRING SOUNDS. This number was slightly less than anticipated, due to a tremendous downpour before showtime. Ireland Regnier fascinated everyone in attendance with his skill on a Flamenco quitar. The audience, consisting mainly of students, enjoyed the Caravelles, an up-and-coming rock'n roll group. Their rendition of several "Beatle" hits was well accepted by all those in attendance.

To satisfy the taste of other people and to provide a variety of entertainment, folk-singing groups and the big-band sound of the Jungaleers and Blue Notes were also included on the program. The Santa Maria Four as well as The Sergeants presented several popular folk-songs. The Stumphole Trio gave their version of popular folk-songs. Another group, The Tiger Tones, added more rock'n roll music to the program. Their version of "Sixty-Minute Man" proved quite popular. Everyone attending SPRING SOUNDS enjoyed a night of fine, varied entertainment.
