National Information Technology Committee Report

I love summer.

Don't get me wrong....it's great when school is in session, and Psi business is in full swing. But for my money, nothing beats summer. It's a time to catch up on projects, delve into the wish lists, blaze some new trails, and even take a bit of a breather, all without the day to day grind.

Since last report, we've tackled a number of interesting projects.

As a result of an appropriation at the 2006 National Convention, we've purchased a digital camcorder. Our new toy is a JVC Everio G Digital camcorder. The tapeand disc-less design features a 20GB hard drive, lots of neat little features such as push-button battery and recording time monitor, fantastic zoom capability and very good low light recording. With it we've purchased an extended life battery, a tripod, and a carrying case. This gizmo will be dedicated to recording national fraternity events—such as National Convention, anniversary celebrations, and the like—and is well suited for webbased and digital storage of our records. This fall, the NITC will establish specific criteria for the storage, distribution, and care of the unit.

Also as a result of Convention, the NITC has set to work making the national fraternity goals accessible to all Brothers. With luck, by press time you will see a National Goals forum on the intranet, with all you ever wanted to know about what we're planning and how we're doing in reaching our targets.

Elsewhere, NITC has assisted the National Committee on Chapter Maintenance obtain collaborative software for manual and policy writing. The new tool, called WakkaWiki, will allow the committee to interactively write and edit documents. We're still getting our feet wet, but it looks like a powerful new tool.

NITC is also embarking on a mission to automate a number of the required submissions from Chapters to the National Office. In the queue are online submissions for address lists, initiation reports, alumni reports, and more. Stay tuned for more details!
